

IP & Tech Law Certificate Experiential Requirement

The IP & Technology Law Certificate requires that students complete two credits or 100 hours of an experiential learning opportunity. This requirement can be satisfied in any of the following ways:

- 1. IP & Tech Law Capstone or Practicum courses;
- 2. The Law & Innovation Lab;
- 3. An externship approved by an IP & Tech Law Faculty Director and coordinated through the Legal Externship Program where the student works at least 100 hours in IP and/or technology law;
- 4. An internship (a work experience not arranged through the Externship Program) where the student works at least 100 hours in IP and/or technology law;
- 5. Another experiential learning opportunity as approved by an IP & Tech Law Faculty Director.
- * Externship and Internship require employers to fill out the Externship/Internship Employer Form on the following page.
